

## Services Proposal

In early October, the General Manager of the Alpine Springs County Water

District, John Collins, announced his retirement after 15 years of service. Their District's Board of Directors prepared and approved a revised Job Description and are currently advertising to fill the position. Similar to contractual services the District provides to the Squaw Valley Mutual Water Company for O&M services, to Placer County for snow removal services on the bike trail, and to the State of California for fighting wildfires with OVFD Strike Teams, staff intends to propose services to the ASCWD for management services. As with our other service contracts, revenue will be used to support District operations, offset salaries, and reduce water and sewer rates for OVPSD customers if our proposal to provide services is accepted. The application deadline is Nov. 30<sup>th</sup>; interviews are Dec 7-9<sup>th</sup>; and the start date is Jan. 4, 2021.
