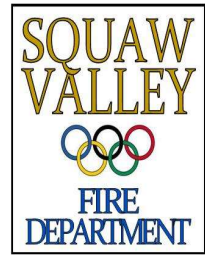

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

March 19, 2020

The Squaw Valley Public Service District, like most other organizations, has modified its operations to adapt to the risks associated with the Coronavirus to ensure the health and safety of our employees and the community we serve.

We understand the criticality of our continued services – the importance of having clean water running from the tap, responding quickly to an emergency medical call or fire, and keeping sewage flowing to the treatment plant.

Our staff are highly dedicated to this community and are committed to providing these services. Following guidance from health professionals, we have implemented until further notice the following changes to best protect staff's health so they can continue to show up for work:

- The Administration Building and Squaw Valley Fire Station 21 is Closed to the Public
 - Use of the Community Meeting Room is currently suspended.
 - Notary Services are suspended.
- Public Board and Committee Meetings will be conducted via teleconference and be accessible to the public by telephone and / or computer.
- District staff are following protocols to implement social distancing including teleworking, departmental isolation within the building, and rotating shifts to keep a strong “bench”.
