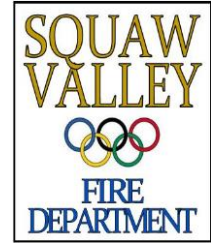

DISTRICT ELECTION PROCESS – 2018

- The Squaw Valley Public Service District is governed by a five-member Board of Directors and they are elected to staggered, four-year terms.
- Elections are held every two years, during even-year November General Elections.
- Directors are elected at large by the voters within District boundaries, which includes a portion of the Truckee River Corridor.
- Registered voters within District boundaries are eligible to run for office.
- Current Director's compensation is \$600 per month for attendance at all regular, special and committee meetings of the Board and other Board-directed meetings, trainings and events. The District also offers a \$6,000 per year reimbursement for eligible medical expenses for Directors/family.
- Elections are conducted by Placer County. Voters interested in running for office are required to file candidate nomination papers with Placer County. Candidate procedures and filing schedules may be obtained from Placer County Elections Division.
- Candidate filing for District Director positions begin **July 16, 2018** and closes **August 10, 2018**. Nomination materials are available at the Customs House Building located at 775 North Lake Blvd., Tahoe City, starting July 17th through August 9th, Tuesday through Thursday, from 11am to 3:30pm. Completed nomination materials are returned to the Placer County Office of Elections or the Customs House Building (775 North Lake Blvd., Tahoe City) for filing.
- Free candidate workshops will be conducted by the Placer County Elections Office. A workshop is scheduled for Friday, June 29th at 6:00 p.m. at the Tahoe City Customs House. Workshop information is provided on their website: www.placerelections.com.

- Candidates are required to file a Statement of Economic Interests under §87200 of the Political Reform Act. The Act requires public disclosure of certain investments, interests and incomes that may pose potential conflicts of interest. Additionally, newly elected public officials are required to attend Ethics Training and Harassment Prevention Training within one year of taking office.
