DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS

- The Squaw Valley Public Service District is governed by a five-member Board of Directors and they are elected to staggered, four-year terms.
- Elections are held every two years, during even-year November General Elections.
- Directors are elected at large by the voters within District boundaries, which includes a portion of the Truckee River Corridor.
- **Registered voters** within District boundaries are eligible to run for office.
- Elections are conducted by Placer County. Voters interested in running for office are required to file candidate nomination papers with Placer County. Candidates may contact the Placer County Elections Division in Auburn for more information and filing materials.

Candidates are required to file a Statement of Economic Interests under §87200 of the Political Reform Act. The Act requires public disclosure of certain investments, interests and incomes that may pose potential conflicts of interest. Newly elected public officials are required to attend Ethics Training and Harassment Prevention Training within one year of taking office.
