

- Achieve and maintain a 50% cost recovery for youth recreation programs



Parks and Recreation 2018 Operation Budget Highlights

- Annual Revenue = \$1,557,507
- Annual Direct Operating Expenses = \$3,477,275
- Net Operating Loss = \$1,919,768
- Non-Direct Operating Expenses = \$878,936
- Total Operating Loss = \$2,798,704
- Annual Property Tax Subsidy for Operations = \$2,798,704
