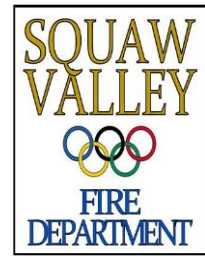

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: Squaw Valley Public Service District Board Elections

The Squaw Valley Public Service District is governed by a five-member Board of Directors and they are elected to staggered, four-year terms. In 2018, the District will have two seats up for election to serve for four-years. Elections are held every two years, during even-year November General Elections. Directors are elected at large by the voters within District boundaries, including a portion of the Truckee River Corridor. Only registered voters within District boundaries are eligible to run for office.

Elections are conducted by Placer County and registered voters interested in running for office are required to file candidate nomination papers with Placer County. Candidate filing for District Director positions begins July 16th and closes August 10th. Nomination materials are available at the Customs House Building located at 775 North Lake Blvd., Tahoe City, starting July 17th through August 9th, Tuesday through Thursday, from 11:00am to 3:30pm. Completed nomination materials are returned to the Placer County Office of Elections or the Customs House Building (775 North Lake Blvd., Tahoe City) for filing.

A free candidate workshop will be conducted by the Placer County Elections Division on June 29th at 6:00 p.m. at the Tahoe City Customs House building.
